

New Recycling Guidelines

As of October 1, 2009



No longer do you have to separate paper from plastic bottles, metal and glass—just mix all your recyclables together!

It's that easy to recycle with the new, no-sort system called "single-stream recycling."

What types of recyclables can I mix together?

You can mix paper, plastic bottles, metal and glass:

PAPER AND CARDBOARD PRODUCTS: Newspapers and inserts; magazines; catalogs; telephone books; office paper, mail and junk mail; cardboard boxes, cereal boxes and tissues boxes (flatten all boxes for the best use of space).

PLASTIC CONTAINERS: Plastic bottles (neck narrower than body) (rinsed, and without caps or lids). Do not include bottles that contained hazardous materials such as paint, motor oil or pesticides.

METALS: Containers made of steel, tin and aluminum (please rinse).

GLASS: Glass bottles and jars--all colors (no caps)

What items cannot be recycled?

No charge for this for drop off.
